We are looking for educators who have received training using specific software to capture quality teaching and create learning resources through screencasting, video, slides, etc. (It also works to team up and collaborate with tech support who has the know-how!)

With the new \$2 million TechSmith grant for Michigan educators, making available free Camtasia & SnagIt software, several ISD/REMC/RESAs will be offering technical training on how to create quality learning resources. Contact your local REMC to find out if training opportunities are available for creating digital content.

Educators who participate in technical training to capture educational material and who apply for a stipend to post learning resources on MI Learning will be given preference during the review process.

Applicants will have a choice of participation levels:

- Receive \$500 for creating 12 quality learning resources per topic/course, or
 - Receive \$1000 & MACUL Conference Registration for creating 24 resources per topic/course.
- Educators may collaborate with others to create resources in one topic/course area and share the stipend.

Note: The funding will be distributed after resources are posted on MI Learning. Applications will be accepted from June 2010 - June 2011 with resources posted by Sept 2011.

Again, any Michigan educator can share quality resources at any time - without applying for a stipend. Feel free to contact me with any questions!
